Problems in Norway:

The 5th of February 2018, the group "Nature and youth" appealed the judgement because of the oil and gas drilling in the Arctic. This appellation was because the Norwegian government inflected the Article 112 from the Norwegian Constitution allowing the companies drill in the Arctic.

Art. 112: Everyone has the right to a healthy environment, including future generations, and the State has a duty to safeguard these rights.

In Barets sea, a group of Greenpeace is trying to stop the Statoil authorization to exploit a virgin area looking for oil. This exploitation could have really bad consequences for the environment and for the species of that space as, for example, whales. Whales have been threatened in Norway because of the whaling (whale hunting), considered as culture and tradition. But now that this kind of practice is being reduce and whales can come back, Statoil wants to exploit this area and destroy a virgin area.

Solutions:

Promote the uses of renewable energies instead of oil:
Greenpeace has created a sustainable program "Energy 3.0" which is based, mostly, on renewable energy and sustainable solutions for houses, industry, and transport to stop oil drilling.
